René Keet is a psychiatrist and a director of the community mental health service GGZ-Noord-Holland-Noord. This service integrates the care provided by Flexible Assertive Community Treatment (F-ACT) teams and specialized ambulatory teams in a catchment area of 600.000 inhabitants in the North-West of The Netherlands. The service includes also activity centres, consumer run companies and sheltered living facilities. His specialization is in integrated recovery oriented treatment of persons with severe mental illness. He leads the FIT Academy: Flexible, Innovative Top-ambulatory care, that provides training to support reform of community mental health care.

He is chair of the European Community Mental Health Services network (EUCOMS), a network of services and their clients in 17 European countries.

His research experience is in the European First Episode Schizophrenia Trial (EUFEST), a naturalistic trial on the effectiveness of antipsychotic medication in a naturalistic community setting. He was the coordinator of Family Motivational Intervention (FMI), in which it was shown that it is feasible and effective to train family members in motivational interviewing. He did research on the evaluation of the introduction of Flexible Assertive Community Treatment in a new region in The Netherlands
