

Laura Shields-Zeeman, Ph.D., MPH, is a Senior Healthcare Implementation Specialist at the Dutch Institute for Mental Health and Addiction (Trimbos Institute), where she leads and contributes to a number of mental health service development and research projects in Europe and South Asia aiming to bridge the gap between research, policy and practice. She has published on a range of public health topics including mental health and human rights, maternal health, and the development and implementation of community-based health and social care interventions in low-resource settings. She has received grants from the U.S National Institute of Mental Health, the European Commission, Swiss Development Cooperation and Grand Challenges Canada. She holds a Masters' in Public Health (*cum laude*) and Ph.D. from VU University Amsterdam in the Netherlands. Shields-Zeeman is currently a co-Principal Investigator on a U.S National Institute of Mental Health funded U-19 hub on mental health implementation research in South Asia (SPIRIT: Suicide Prevention and Implementation Research Initiative), and co-Principal Investigator on the RECOVER-E project, funded through the EU's Horizon 2020 Programme, focused on community mental health services development and evaluation in 5 Central and Eastern European countries.
